The price of success is that sometimes there is not enough of a good thing to go around. It happens almost every term, when 10 or 12 classes have more requests for enrollment than available seats in the room. In some situations we are able to duplicate the course for the overflow of members, if that works for the speaker and a suitable time and place can be arranged. Other times it involves renting a larger venue, but that’s not a fix in every case. So, when we can’t make such helpful changes, some people are disappointed. It has happened during the current term a couple of times and that’s regrettable. Everyone involved is doing the best they can do and we ask for your patience while we try to work things out. We may be able to offer some encores of the most popular courses sometime soon. Courtesy is the next concern I must mention. The people that make up our OLLI population are a fascinating bunch. Amazing levels of talent, experience, and civility. About 300 of our members volunteer for the many, diverse tasks involved in producing the programs and managing the many details of the organization every year. That’s remarkable. We have two paid professionals in our system: Our office personnel, **Karen and Barb**, who are among the very nicest people I’ve ever known. Plus they are skilled in their roles, patient with frustrated or rude OLLI members, and try to find solutions for every problem—which is not easy. We are so fortunate that they choose to work with OLLI, even when they have to take “furlough” days, without pay, because of UCI’s financial crunch.

When I hear that an OLLI member forgot the manners that I’m certain their moms taught them, raising voices with demands or insults in speaking with the personnel, I am very disappointed. The same issue exists when a disgruntled member treats any of the volunteers who develop and facilitate the courses and events without respect. The University of California rule of the road on situations such as this is: Verbal assault, oral or written, on any UCI employee—or OLLI volunteer--will not be tolerated. Just like mom said, “*Please and thank you* are your friends!”

To fill you in on current Board activities, **Pam McGovern**, Director, Community Outreach, has initiated a Central Orange County search for a possible change in the location for OLLI at UCI. We need a bit more room (a large and a small classroom, and a possible small computer lab), easier access for we seasoned adults, adequate parking, and an office with more elbow-room. And—we want to pay less than our current contract with the Irvine Company. **Gary Obert**, Director, Assessment and Planning, is lending welcome assistance in this project. We’ll keep everyone posted as we view possibilities. Our current lease lapses in June, although we may continue on a month-to-month basis until we find something that better fulfills our needs—or decide to re-up our Woodbridge lease.

Thanks for being enthusiastic participants. It’s a real pleasure to hear from members who are so pleased with what is being taught and learned every day in the programs. Remember to tell your friends that OLLI would welcome them, too. *Julie Hume*, President

**SE 20 WEISMAN COLLECTION AND HAMMER MUSEUM
An OLLI Fundraising Event --Tuesday, February 2, 2010**

Back by popular demand, this is a rare opportunity to tour the extensive private art collection of Frederick R. Weisman. The collection displays more than 500 works of art including works by Cezanne, Picasso, Kandinsky, Rauschenberg, Johns, Rothko, and many more. The collection is housed in a two-story 1920's Mediterranean-style villa and a contemporary annex.

NOTE: Since there are many stairs, no elevator, and no resting or seating areas, those with physical/walking difficulties are discouraged from taking this tour. Walkers are not permitted. The tour will run 90 minutes.

We will travel by van to the Weisman museum. Lunch is on your own. After lunch, we will tour the Hammer Museum in Westwood. The Hammer houses much of philanthropist Armand Hammer's extensive art collection.

OLLI OPENS FIRST SATELLITE CENTER

OLLI's first satellite operation is now in its first official semester of operation at the Laguna Beach Community Center. The facility is located in a new modern building located at the foot of the infamous 3rd Street hill. The parking is FREE!

Nine classes covering a wide range of topics make up this semester's curriculum. Individuals may become **Associate** OLLI members by paying a \$20 membership fee that covers this term and the Spring term at the Susi Q. There is a \$10 per course fee for enrollment.
